

17th Annual Joan Ballweg Leadership Scholarship Summary

Area of Study: General

Description: The Joan Ballweg Leadership Scholarship was established in April 2005, and will continue as long as I am in elected office. The purpose is to encourage and reward students who have taken a role in leadership during their high school years. Hopefully you will continue your leadership roles in college and after you graduate. Your leadership skills will be valuable to your employer in the workplace and the community where you live.

Requirements: All graduating seniors continuing their education in a 2-year technical college program or a 4-year baccalaureate degree program are eligible. Students must be graduating with at least a 3.0 average on a 4.0 point scale and must reside in the 14th Senate District. They must demonstrate leadership by participating in groups and organizations as officers, captains, or other roles of authority.

Examples of groups or activities include: student council, class officer, officer of student organizations such as NHS or FFA, captains of teams (whether athletic or academic), student directors for music or drama, positions in organizations outside of school such as 4-H, church groups, volunteer organizations or non-school athletics, music and arts, or academic competitions.

Amount: Up to twelve, \$500 scholarships will be awarded, based on the quality and quantity of applicants.

A minimum of one letter of recommendation is necessary, but no more than two will be accepted.

Candidates must be a resident of the 14th State Senate District during their senior year. Wisconsin State Senate District 14 covers parts of Adams, Columbia, Dane, Dodge, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Juneau, Marquette, Outagamie, Sauk, Waupaca and Waushara Counties.
