

Social Media Policy & Community Guidelines

Senator Keyeski encourages respectful and civil dialogue on her pages.

Community Guidelines

The below (including but not limited to) types of comments/posts are prohibited on Senator Keyeski's social media site and are subject to removal by the Office of Senator Keyeski:

- Content that is threatening, abusive, harassing, defamatory, profane, obscene or indecent
- Content that contains hate speech or discriminates against a protected class
- Campaign content, including content urging or opposing the nomination or election of a candidate
- Content or conduct that encourages illegal activity or in violation of a federal, state or local law
- Content that is unrelated to the topic being discussed or business of the State of Wisconsin
- Content that infringes on a copyright, trademark, or other proprietary right of any party
- Content that is confidential, invasive of another person's privacy, or contains personal information
- Advertisements, solicitations, or other content that promotes or endorses services or products
- Content that tends to compromise the safety and security of the public, including state employees
- Content that is repetitive or spamming in nature including posting the same comment multiple times
- Content that disrupts the normal flow of dialogue or negatively affects other users' ability to engage in discussions on this page
