Senator Agard on her Final Senate Floor Session

MADISON – Today, the Wisconsin State Senate held the final session of the 2023-2025 session, as indicated by Republican leadership. State Senator Melissa Agard (D-Madison) released the following statement:

"The end of the legislative session is an important time to reflect back on what we've accomplished. I want to acknowledge that we've achieved some big, bipartisan wins this session like increasing shared revenue for local governments all over the state, keeping the Brewers right here in Wisconsin for generations to come, and increasing funding for services to victims of sexual assault and domestic violence.
