Wisconsin Schools Rise in Rankings Under Governor Evers

New findings released by respected U.S. News & World Reports rank Wisconsin's education system 8th in the nation, an improvement from the number 18 ranking Wisconsin schools were given just before Governor Tony Evers took office. New Jersey ranks first, while New Mexico ranked dead last. Wisconsin outranks all of our neighboring states; the closest is Illinois at #11. The rankings take into account both K-12 and Higher Education.



Racine Joins Kenosha, Will Have Public Safety Referendum on Fall Ballot

This November, voters in the city of Racine will be given a say in whether to allow an increase in their property taxes to fund additional police officers. If approved, the \$2 million referendum would fund 11 new police positions.

As mentioned in a previous edition of this newsletter, steep cuts in shared revenue to counties and municipalities under the Republican-controlled Legislature and former Governor Scott Walker have left many communities struggling to fund critical services such as public safety.

Pleasant Prairie voters passed a similar referendum earlier this spring.



Judge Finds Gableman in Contempt After Refusing to Answer Questions on Phony, Taxpayer-Funded Election "Review"

Former state Supreme Court Justice Michael Gableman was found in contempt of court this week for not fully complying with a previous court order to provide requested public records related to his taxpayer-funded "investigation" of the 2020 Presidential election. Circuit Court Judge Frank Remington made the contempt ruling after Gableman refused to answer questions in the case, indicated that he had no plans to ever answer the questions and called the judge a

"partisan advocate". Zakory Niemierowicz, a staff person hired to help in Gableman's witchhunt, didn't attend Friday's court hearing for fear that he would be incarcerated; the judge had previously warned Gableman and Niemierowicz that they were facing potential jail time if they continued their refusal to answer questions.

Trump. Trump and his allies have continuously spouted debunked conspiracy theories regarding the legitimacy of the 2020 Presidential election. Gableman's review has been the source of one scandal after another, including going over budget by hundreds of thousands of dollars and producing no evidence of fraud. Vos recently allowed the "investigation" to continue, and Gableman to continue drawing a paycheck on the taxpayer dime, even though the official review is on pause pending the outcome of several court cases.

Society's Assets is a local nonprofit Independent Living Center serving people of all ages with any disability; the name Society's Assets was chosen because the founders wanted to be seen as having abilities and qualities to contribute to the community.

Kenosha Aging and Family Services, Inc. (KAFASI), is seeking more volunteer drivers to help local senior citizens and adults with disabilities get to important appointments, doctor visits, grocery shopping or the bank. Dawn Skau is the KAFASI Volunteer Coordinator. She says KAFASI is in need of area residents, age 18 and up, interested in volunteering with their transportation program. Volunteers must use their own vehicle, have auto insurance, and pass a background check; drivers are reimbursed for mileage at 45 cents per mile. KUSD Hosting "Building Trade Careers Summer Camp" to Introduce Students to New Career Possibilities


KUSD students entering grades 7-9 can now sign up to attend a four day summer camp-style program that will introduce them to careers in the building trades. The camp will take place from July 18-21, 2022, from 8 am to noon each day. Students interested in careers in the architecture and construction career cluster are encouraged to apply. The camp will expose students to many of the different careers in the field. Students will participate in four hands-on demonstrations and presentations while learning side-by-side with local building trade employees from three local companies – Riley Construction, Pieper Electric, and Martin Petersen Company. The camp will conclude with a visit to a local construction project to see what they have been learning in action. Student transportation from the KUSD Educational Support Center, 3600 52nd St., to the local employers and back to the ESC will be provided.
The Building Trade Careers Summer Camp lottery enrollment is open through Sunday, June 19, 2022. Only one lottery enrollment per student will be accepted. The lottery will take place the week of June 20, 2022, and notification of enrollment or waitlist status will be sent to all enrollees by June 24, 2022. EIGHT MORE Free Covid Tests Available

With Covid cases again on the rise, the Biden administration has is offering households eight additional at-home Covid tests, free of charge. You can order the eight tests at https://www.covidtests.gov/; you can also use this site to find nearby testing locations. The administration had previously made four at-home Covid tests available per household; you can still claim those using the same link if you haven't already done so. Additionally, because of

actions by President Biden and Governor Evers, your health insurance provider may be required to cover up to eight at-home rapid tests per month.
