In 1954, Congress passed and President Eisenhower signed a bill formally proclaiming November 11 as Veterans Day; in November 1982, Raymond Weeks was awarded the Presidential Citizens Medal. There are currently more than 16.5 million veterans living in the United States. Take the time today to thank the veterans in your life.

Public Service Commission Extends Comment Period on WE Energies Rate Hike

Late last week, my colleague Sen. Tim Carpenter (D-Milwaukee) and I sent a joint letter to the state Public Service Commission (PSC) expressing our concern with both the residential electric customer rate increases proposed by WE Energies and the end to the public comment period, which was scheduled to close at 5 pm on Monday, November 7. Until now, most consumers weren't aware of the rate increases WE Energies was seeking. With the issue getting more

news coverage recently, we were concerned that the November 7 date didn't provide consumers enough time to register their opinions. Well, this week, we got some good news, as the PSC agreed to extend the public comment period by one week, through Monday, November 14.

This gives consumers more time to read up on the proposal and share their concerns.

Earlier this year, WE Energies had requested a 5-6% electric rate increase on residential customers, then increased that number to 8.4% before finally settling on 13%. Meanwhile the company had originally planned to increase the electric rate for big business customers by 11-14% before slashing that in half, to 6.4%. This represents a shift of the financial burden from big businesses to families and small businesses. The proposed rate increase would mean the average family pays about \$175 a year more for electric service.

BBB Teams with Amazon on New Scam Tracker Tool

The Better Business Bureau (BBB) Institute for Marketplace Trust is partnering with Amazon and Capital One to help people learn about, avoid and report scams through an upgraded BBB

Scam Tracker tool. New features make it easier for consumers to identify scams and report them, while arming partners with more robust data on scammers to better protect consumers. BBB Scam Tracker was launched in 2015; the scam tracker tool has saved consumers \$31.4 million in 2021 alone. Partnering with Amazon and Capital One will allow BBB to expand the tool's impact. The new BBB Scam Tracker makes it easier for consumers to report scams via mobile or desktop. It includes a new guided questionnaire that makes it quick and easy to report a scam. Consumers can now review and edit their reports before submission, and then share the report with friends and family via social media or email. They also have the option to receive updates about the constantly evolving tactics that scammers use.

An upgraded search function enables consumers to search scams in the tools by email address, phone number, and more.

Healthcare.gov Open Enrollment Has Begun

The open enrollment period on the individual health insurance marketplace known as healthcare.gov has now begun. The period started on November 1, 2022, and lasts until January 15, 2023.

During this limited time, all Wisconsinites are eligible to get enrolled in one of the health plans available on the federal marketplace. Those who already have insurance through the marketplace can also renew, update or upgrade their health plans during this period. In 2020, Governor Tony Evers directed the Office of the Commissioner of Insurance and the Department of Health Services to create WisCovered.com, an accessible resource to connect consumers with free, expert help. These experts assist Wisconsinites in understanding their coverage options and determining if they qualify for subsidized health insurance premiums through the marketplace or low-cost coverage through BadgerCare Plus.



Wisconsin Launches Program to Send Out Free Covid Tests


Wisconsin residents can now get Covid-19 tests sent to them free of charge from the state. The federal government had been offering free Covid tests, but the funding for that program has run out.

The Wisconsin Dept. of Health Services (DHS) says that the <u>Say Yes! Covid Test website</u> is now live and operational. The site allows households to order five rapid tests for free. Households can still get up to eight rapid Covid tests per month through their insurance providers, as well.
