## Wirch Co-Authors Bipartisan Bill Restoring Bargaining Rights on Health Care for Public Safety Employees

This week, I announced that I am co-authoring legislation with Sen. Van Wanggaard (R-Racine), Rep. Tip McGuire (D-Kenosha) and Rep. Bob Donovan (R-Greenfield) that would restore the right of public safety employees to bargain over the terms of their health care plans. Many of us remember the fight over Act 10, the legislation pushed by former Governor Scott

Walker just days into his first term that eliminated collective bargaining rights for public employees. Public safety employees were exempted from some of these limitations, but a recent ruling by the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission (WERC) declared that they are not legally allowed to bargain over the details of their health care plans or even IF they have a health care plan. These men and women put their lives on the line each time they report for duty; we owe it to them to at least give them a say in the health care coverage provided to them and their families. The bill is currently being circulated for co-sponsors in the Legislature.



## *Evers Budget Includes Largest State Investment in Homelessness Initiatives in Wisconsin History*

As part of his 2023-2025 state budget, Governor Tony Evers has proposed \$16.5 million per year on initiatives to support the homeless. This would represent the largest non-pandemic investment in homelessness programs in state history and includes funding for homelessness prevention, veteran rental assistance, and support to landlords to make quality housing available. Evers has repeatedly attempted to fund the recommendations of the bipartisan Wisconsin Interagency Council on Homelessness but has faced obstruction from legislative Republicans. The Governor's proposal would fully fund the Council's most recent set of recommendations, released in March 2022.

#### Wisconsin Families Can Now Get Ten (10) Free Covid Tests Each Month

Wisconsin residents can now get up to 10 free Covid-19 testing kits sent straight to their doors each month as part of the Wisconsin Department of Health Services' Say Yes! Covid Test Program. Since starting in September 2022, the <u>Say Yes! Covid Test</u> program has delivered more than 1.6 million free test kits throughout Wisconsin. Households were previously limited to one free test kit (5 tests) per month but can now receive two, containing 10 tests. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has extended the shelf life for several Covid tests, including iHealth, which are delivered through the Say Yes! Covid Test program; tests are now good for up to one year. To order the test kits online, visit sayyescovidhometest.org.
