To the Honorable Members of Wisconsin's Congressional Delegation:

We urge you to take bi-partisan action to oppose unprecedented cuts to Medicaid (MA), which would negatively affect millions of Wisconsin residents – urban and rural, Republican and Democrat, young and old.

While the final shape and size of funding reductions may not yet be apparent, the impact for the people we represent of a change of the magnitude being discussed (\$2.3 trillion)<sup>1</sup> is abundantly clear: rural hospitals will close, seniors will be evicted from nursing homes, people with disabilities will be institutionalized instead of living in cost-effective community settings, and children will languish on waiting lists for lifesaving care.

In fact, Wisconsin's rural communities and populations will bear the brunt of these cuts. In 27 rural counties across northern and central Wisconsin, the share of children on Medicaid is higher than the state average. In most counties in northern Wisconsin, more than a third of children are

enrolled in Medicaid.<sup>2</sup> At many rural hospitals and clinics, Medicaid provides insurance for the majority of patients.

Beyond its critical functions as a lifesaving program that provides access to necessary services to 1.2 million Wisconsinites, Medicaid is a workforce program. The families and individuals who utilize MA employ service providers and pay their wages. They use small businesses to provide an array of services, such as transportation. Many people with disabilities who qualify for MA also work in community jobs, earning wages and creating positive economic impacts.

Recent surveys show that 81% of Americans oppose cutting Medicaid and 71% say Medicaid should continue in its current form.<sup>3</sup> Under 2017 Wisconsin Act 370, the legislature has the responsibility to oversee and authorize MA spending and changes in our state. That means that state legislators cannot avoid accountability for the disruption that massive cuts would create to this program that is fundamental to so many lives.

We cite the aforementioned issues – the disproportionate effect of cuts on rural communities and populations, the positive workforce effects, the broad support for MA, and the responsibility of state legislators for the program – because those are often overlooked in discussions about MA. It is a complex program that has been improving and saving lives for 60 years.

But ultimately, at the heart of the matter, is the unspeakable human toll cuts of this size would have on our fellow Wisconsinites. They are elderly people, veterans, children and adults with disabilities, parents and families who will suffer – there is no other word for it – because of a decision we choose to make.

We are hopeful that through your thoughtful and collaborative bi-partisan efforts, disastrous cuts to Medicaid will not come to pass. Thank you for your public service. Please do not hesitate to reach out to any of us with questions or to discuss this further.
