Hesselbein Applauds Governor's Budget Address

MADISON – Tonight, Governor Tony Evers delivered his 2021-23 Budget Address, outlining Wisconsin's spending plan for the next biennium. Evers delivered his address virtually to a joint session of the Wisconsin State Legislature. Assembly Assistant Minority Leader, Representative Dianne Hesselbein (D-Middleton) provided the following response:
