## **Senate Adjourns, Lasee Legislation Finishes Strong** *Six bills authored by Senator Lasee pass on final session day*

MADISON – Today, six bills authored by State Senator Frank Lasee (R-De Pere) passed the Senate ([AB 720](#), [AB 584](#), [AB 698](#), [AB 668](#), [AB 702](#), [AB 25](#)). These bills join 13 others authored by Senator Lasee and passed this session.

**“These bills haven’t just been feel-good, do-nothing words to fill the statute books. These are dense, real-world reforms which conservatives and job-creators can get excited about. I’m proud to have authored laws which are fundamentally changing government on behalf of my constituents to achieve a brighter future for Wisconsin,”** said Lasee.

The bills span a wide array, among the most important are:

SB 459, part of my Private Property Rights Package, clarifies and expands the rights of private property owner’s – especially property owners near water. The bill strikes a more reasonable balance between property owners and government that protects the environment, focuses DNR resources on the most sensitive matters, and improves property rights.

AB 582, the second piece of my Private Property Rights Package, fortifies protections for businesses and homeowners from over-reach by government. This law will ensure that bureaucrats can’t interfere with people’s lives or important commerce in this state. This creates certainty for business owners looking to invest in Wisconsin and will stimulate economic growth.

Also important was the budget provision I authored to repeal prevailing wage for local governments. Removing the artificially high costs for government projects is estimated to save taxpayers of \$100 million per year. Because the Lasee Plan repealed prevailing wage, it empowers our local governments to maintain our roads, schools, and infrastructure for less cost than before and stretches our dollars for more roads and better buildings for the money.

**“This has been a productive session, yet there’s more work to be done. I’m honored to represent the First Senate District and will continue to fight for personal freedoms, smaller government, and the free-market principles that haven’t proven time and again to make our economy and country great,”** Lasee said.
