Youth Crisis Stabilization Facility  
[LFB Paper #358]

Motion:

Move to adopt Alternatives A1 of LFB Issue Paper #358, which would adopt the Governor's recommendation to create a definition and certification process for youth crisis stabilization facilities.

Adopt Alternative C2a and C2b, which would: (a) specify that funding for the youth crisis stabilization grants would be provided on a one-time basis and would require DHS to include a proposal in its 2019-21 biennial budget request to provide ongoing funding for grants using an appropriation from the general fund; and (b) create a sum-certain PR appropriation for making youth crisis stabilization grants.

In addition, delete \$249,100 PR in 2017-18 and \$996,400 PR in 2018-19 that the bill would provide in the Department's interagency and intra-agency programs appropriation for youth crisis stabilization grants. Provide \$1,245,500 PR in 2017-18 in the Committee's supplemental appropriation from revenues in the mental health institutes program revenue account. Specify that the Department may submit a request under s. 13.10 of the statutes for an appropriation supplement for up to \$1,245,500 for funding for youth crisis stabilization grants. Specify that any such request must be submitted prior to the Department soliciting proposals for grants and must include a description of the Department's plan for distributing grants, including the conditions that the Department would specify for the expenditure of grant funds and the criteria the Department proposes to use for selecting grantees. Specify that the Committee may approve or modify and approve the plan submitted by the Department.

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Note:

This motion would approve the proposed definition and certification process for a youth crisis stabilization facility, but would modify the funding proposal by adopting Alternatives C2a, and C2b of LFB Issue Paper #358, which would create a new PR appropriation for making grants and specify that the PR funding would be provided on a one-time basis. Funding for the grants would be provided in the Committee's supplemental appropriation. DHS would be required to submit a description of the plan for making youth crisis stabilization facility grants if the Department requests release of the grant funding.
